ORDINANCE NO. 2-1993

ORDINANCE OF THE PORT OF NEWPORT AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1-1991, RELATING TO COLLECTION OF PORT CHARGES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 1-1991 was adopted on January 22, 1991, and sets forth the rules and regulations governing the administration of properties of the Port of Newport, including the procedural requirements governing the collection of charges for Port services and moorage; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Port of Newport hereby determine that the collection of Port charges should be done promptly after an account becomes past due; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Port of Newport possesses the authority to secure and/or remove vessels (within the meaning of Ordinance 1-1991) and personal property in the collection of the charges mentioned above; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Port of Newport has determined that the securing of vessels and personal property should be done promptly after the charges mentioned have become delinquent.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners of the Port of Newport hereby ordain as follows:

- 1. Ordinance No. 1-1991, Part II, Section 3(a) is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:
- "(a) Past Due/Delinquent: Any account (other than transient moorage) which remains unpaid in whole or in part thirty (30) days after invoice shall be considered past due and delinquent."
- 2. Subsection (b) of Ordinance No. 1-1991, Part II, Section 3 is hereby repealed in its entirety, and the balance of the subsections under Part II, Section 3 are hereby relettered, such that Subsection (c) becomes Subsection (b), Subsection (d) becomes Subsection (e) becomes Subsection (d).

- 3. Ordinance No. 1-1991, Part II, Section 6(a) is hereby amended to read as follows:
- "(a) No Prior Notice to Resident Vessel Owner/Operator Nor to Owner/Bailee of Personal Property: The Port shall in no way be obligated to give the owner and/or operator of a vessel or the owner and/or bailee of personal property, notice prior to the securing or removal of a resident vessel or personal property."

This ordinance being necessary for the peace, health, safety and welfare of the users of the Port of Newport facilities and for the financial welfare of the Port of Newport, an emergency is declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage by the Board of Commissioners of the Port of Newport.

This Ordinance adopted this 23rd day of March, 1993, by the Board of Commissioners of the Port of Newport.
