The Port of Newport – is located in the City of Newport, Oregon, with cargo terminals located on the north side of the Yaquina Bay. The Port of Newport International Terminal docks and upland infrastructure have been rebuilt and is planning to construct a shipping facility.

The Port was recently named the top commercial fishing port on the west coast.

The harbor is located 115 miles south of the Columbia River, 275 miles south of the entrance to Puget Sound, and 620 miles north of Oakland. Sixty miles east of the Port is the center of the Willamette Valley, Oregon's largest agricultural region. The Port has been a traditional exporter and importer of forest products.

The entrance bar is dredged to 40 feet and the navigation channel and ship turning basin are maintained at a depth of 30 feet. The turning basin located adjacent to this cargo berth is 900 by 1,200 feet wide. Mean tidal range is about 8 feet. Air draft under the highway bridge is 135 feet at low water. The cargo docks are about 1.5 miles from the ocean entrance buoy with transit time from pilot boarding to vessel tie up usually less than 60 minutes.

Berth No. 1

Length: 605'

Depth: 35'

Handling facilities: Mainly used to service Distant Water commercial fishing fleet. Marine diesel oil delivered by tank trucks. Potable fresh water available
